The Importance of Learning a Foreign Language



District Strategic Plan: Global Culture

Promote intercultural understanding so that our students value and are able to interact with people from different social, cultural and linguistic backgrounds.

Action

Promote global communication skills for our K – 12 community through investigation of expansion of our foreign language programs.

Study Group Process

- Researched best practices and current practices in area schools
- Visited FLES program in Harrison CSD
- Attended World Languages Conference at Teacher's College
- Completed District Foreign Language survey
- Foreign language department reflected on current curriculum

What do we want the students of Dobbs Ferry to know and be able to demonstrate at the end of their study of foreign language in our district? What is the goal(s) of our foreign language program?

The Study Group identified the following goals (expected outcomes) for all our students to achieve through their study of foreign language:

- To be able to communicate with other cultures.
- To gain knowledge and understanding (and respect) of other cultures.
- To enable our students to be competitive with other students (locally, nationally, internationally).
- To build competence (proficiency) and confidence in another language that they can build upon in higher education.
- To maximize all opportunities for all student in all 5 "C's" communication, cultures, connections, comparisons and communities (National Standards in Foreign language Education).

Impact on Student Learning

- Contributions to brain development
- Increased creativity and problem solving skills
- Improved memory
- An awareness and appreciation of other cultures
- Lifelong ability to communicate in a global society
- A desire to continue the study of a second language and possibly additional languages

What is FLES?

- Presents a second language as a distinct area of learning
- Follows the natural sequence of language learning (understanding, speaking, reading, writing)
- Primary emphasis is on understanding and speaking
- Emphasis is placed on cultural awareness and appreciation
- Grammar is learned indirectly (through use) rather than being the focal point of lessons
- Usually taught 3 to 5 times per week (75 minutes per week or 90 minutes per cycle)
- Instructional techniques feature visuals, manipulatives, songs, skits and games to fully engage the students in the process of communication

Goals of Springhurst FLES Program

- Enhance development of reading, writing, listening and speaking skills in English and Spanish.
- Acquire an understanding of and appreciation of other cultures
- Support other academic content areas.
- Build language proficiency with each new year of study.
- Further achievement towards state and national language standards.

Goals of Springhurst FLES Program

- Build enthusiasm for language learning through early success which will be transferable to all languages.
- Promote learning of Spanish at a prime language learning time.
- Enhance knowledge of world history and culture and experience increased global awareness.
- Build basic communication skills in target language
