Dobbs Ferry Middle School Guidance Department Hosts Annual Career Days For 6th, 7th and 8th Grade Students

Dobbs Ferry, N.Y. April 20, 2016—An important part of the career development program in Dobbs Ferry Middle School is getting students to start thinking about college and career readiness early on. The Middle School's **annual Career Days kick off this year with the 6th grade on April 21st, followed by the 8th grade on May 6th and the 7th grade on June 8th. Each grade will focus on a related group of job possibilities with numerous parents from the community volunteering to talk about their own career paths.**

The 6th grade theme is the Arts. Students will hear from professionals in multiple fields all within the arts domain. They include an art historian, drummer, photographer, producer, television reporter and artistic director. "Five out of the six presenters are parents of present 6th graders," said counselor Sandra Hacker. "The kids are so excited to have their mom or dad participate in this school-wide event."

In the 7th grade, the goal is to have the students begin to look at their individual strengths, interests and personalities. **The 7th grade Career Day will focus on our exploratory classes which includes STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math)**. Those presenters include a doctor, an engineer, an electrician, a financial advisor, a scientist and a painter. "Even at this age, it is important to be exposed to many different careers and to point out that they use similar skills that might be math-related such as the financial advisor, engineer and electrician," said Ms. Hacker.

Finally, the 8th grade Career Day will look at a number of different fields based on student interest. Using Naviance, an online college and career planning tool, students indicate their top three career interests. Each student is then "matched" with speakers that represent their choices and are given an individual schedule. All of the students will attend an opening ceremony which includes a keynote speaker, followed by four small group presentations. "Students hear about the speakers' career paths and educational backgrounds, job tasks and responsibilities," said counselor Rose Mittan. "The real take-away is learning about the process of looking for a career and developing the self-awareness to find what you are interested in and might want to pursue. The 8th grade speakers include a musician, marketing executive, attorney, photographer, electrical engineer/entrepreneur, real estate broker, pediatrician, police officer, chef/restaurant owner and a child psychologist.

Ms. Hacker and Ms. Mittan both emphasized, "It's so important for students to be exposed early to different career opportunities as it helps them make informed decisions. At this age, the sky's the limit. It's all about finding their passion."
