THE SCHOOL

Located on the hilly eastern bank of the Hudson River, Dobbs Ferry has all the characteristics of a small village located near one of the greatest cities in the world. Our community is almost entirely residential with single-family houses and several large apartment and condominium complexes. Only thirty-five minutes by train from Grand Central Station in New York City, Dobbs Ferry has a small-town atmosphere that is rich in tradition and history.

Dobbs Ferry High School is a an exemplary, four-year comprehensive school with a strong college preparatory program serving a wide range of students. The school serves approximately 450 students in grades 9-12 and the current senior class enrolls 129 students. Over 94% of our graduates pursue further education. The faculty is deeply involved in the development and refinement of programs and encourages students to participate in activities that demand high levels of responsibility and commitment.

Dobbs Ferry High School has a long tradition of academic excellence and success. This excellence is the result of a dedicated faculty, supportive parents, a community that values education, and most importantly motivated students. It is also due to the ongoing support that we receive from the Board of Education for our various academic programs and course offerings. This support has allowed us to offer both the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) and IB Diploma Programme (DP) in addition to our many electives, including Science Research, Theater Arts, Financial Literacy, Competitive Debate, Yearbook, Business For 21st Century, and AP Computer Science. We are also pleased to note that all of our students have the opportunity to take four years of math and science and all of our students enroll in at least two IB DP courses in either eleventh or twelfth grade.

Dobbs Ferry High School is a special place and we take pride in our ability to meet the individual needs of our students through our wide variety of curricular and extra-curricular opportunities. Dobbs Ferry High School offers programs in baseball, track, basketball, volleyball, softball, lacrosse, wrestling, tennis, soccer, and football. Other opportunities for extracurricular participation include involvement in the following clubs: Book Club, Music Appreciation, Student Government, International Club, Destination Imagination, Peer Tutoring, Yearbook, Theater Arts, AcaFellas, Chess Club, GSA, Hands-In Service, History Bowl Creative Writing, Fundraising, Model UN, Television, STEM, Competitive Debate, GSA, Youth-to-Youth, Gender Equality, Art Club, Kindness Club, Mindfulness/Meditation, and Ecology.

Dobbs Ferry High School Program of Studies

In 1998, Dobbs Ferry High School became the first "IB World School" in Westchester County, a distinction that is officially authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). The interdisciplinary approach of the IB Programme is one that is widely viewed by colleges and universities around the world as a comprehensive approach to higher education preparation. IB MYP classes in ninth and tenth grade are designed to prepare students for success in the IB Diploma Programme. The learning experiences and skills that are emphasized in the earlier grades are in-line with the rigors of our IB courses and the IB Learner Profile.

Students have two choices when considering the IB Diploma Program offered at Dobbs Ferry High School. Students can pursue the full IB Diploma or they can choose to take individual IB courses in any of the six groups. Students who pursue the full IB Diploma understand that it is a comprehensive, two-year, pre-university course of study beginning in eleventh grade. The coursework is rigorous, intellectually stimulating, and leads to examinations in which students must demonstrate critical understanding of subject matter. IB courses are open to all students. The IB course of study is the most rigorous program offered at Dobbs Ferry High School and it is designed so that all students may participate.

Dobbs Ferry High School Featured Programs

IB for All

As an IB World School, all students at DFHS enroll in both the IB Middle Years Program (MYP) in grades 9-10, and the IB Diploma Program (DP) in grades 11-12. On average, all students at DFHS enroll in at least four IB DP courses, and approximately 40% of our students pursue



a full IB Diploma. DFHS provides multiple pathways to pursue a full IB Diploma, including co-taught classes. In addition, all students complete an MYP Personal Project in grade ten along with a community service project.

Science Research

The goal of the DFHS Science Research Program is to

provide students with the opportunity to conduct authentic and original scientific research as part of their high school experience. The course will require students to commit for 3 years in conducting original science research. Students





from diverse background and ability levels will read scientific journal articles, contact scientists and engage them as mentors, develop hypotheses, collect and analyze data and eventually present their findings. Students present their research to their peers, their school district, and in science research

competitions (i.e. Intel Science Talent Search, WESROC and WESEF).

Senior Internship

All seniors complete a culminating full-time internship that begins in early May until the end of the year. The internship program contains many of the features of IB

CAS (Community, Action, and Service) while preparing students with an "authentic intellectual" experience that allows them to apply their skills in a real world setting before entering college or the workforce.



Our students are responsible for developing a resume, making contacts with potential sites, setting up and going on interviews, managing their hours and time, establishing contacts, making a "lasting impression" through hard work, and chronicling their experiences via an online blog and a final project.

Visual and Performing Arts

The arts are a critical component of the academic program and allow students to explore and express their creativity. Arts offerings at Dobbs Ferry in-

clude film, fine art, music, band, orchestra, drama, and chorus. The DFHS cultural arts programs have grown over the past few years and have experienced much success in their performances and productions. IB Film students have been honored at the Hen Hud Film Festi-



val as well as received the prestigious Film Award. The musicals, concerts, and IB Art show allow students to show their artistic talents and are always well attended by the community. Every DFHS student is encouraged to get involved in the arts.
