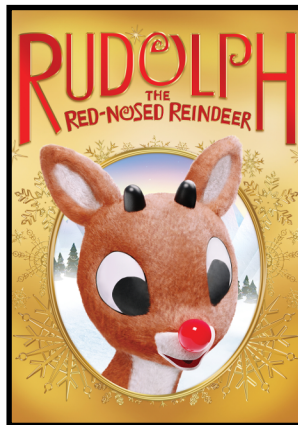
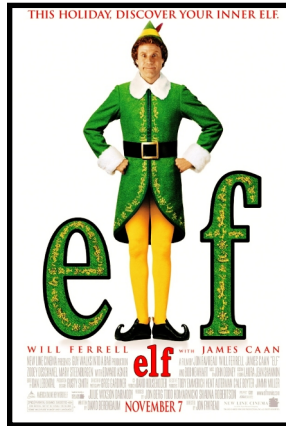
## Ellie's Review: *Elf*

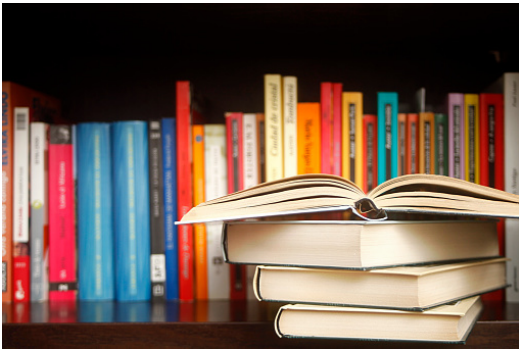

After he presented to us we were allowed to ask him some questions. Some of the questions were, "Have people ever doubted you because of your disability?" Sadly, he answered, "Yes." Another question was "What is the hardest challenge you



have on a daily basis?" He answered "C.P.." Another one was, "What job do you have?" He answered, "I have my dream job giving lectures to college students about disabilities." Another question asked was, "What is your favorite thing to do?" He answered "Go to the movies and listen to audio books." One thing that I think is interesting about what he said was that when he got too emotional at school, he had to sit in the hallway alone. Another is that his family moved to Budapest, Hungary to help in physical therapy and that he now lived in a house with other physically and mentally impaired people. 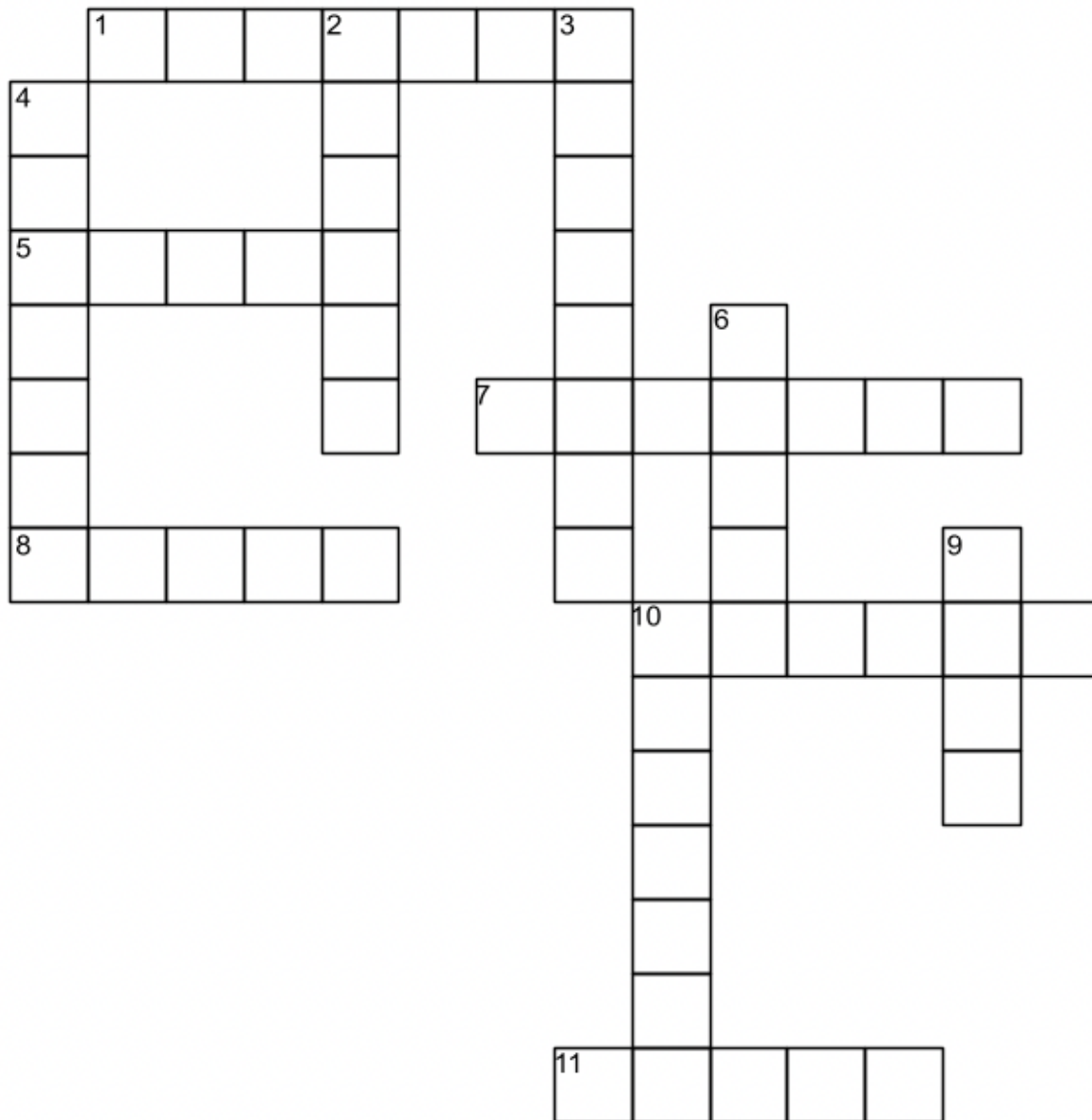
