Budget Remains Well Below Tax Cap and Maintains Programs/Services

Proposition 1

The Dobbs Ferry School District is gradually emerging from the challenges caused by COVID-19, and we are glad to report that next year's school budget will be well below the New York State property tax cap. The proposed 2022-2023 budget maintains existing programs and services for all students, while enabling our District to provide more comprehensive support for student mental health, wellness, social-emotional learning, and safety.

Budget highlights include:

- Adding 1 school counselor (High School)
- Adding 2 special education teachers (High School and Springhurst)
- Adding additional administrative support for Springhurst (Teacher on assignment/Dean)
- Adding instructional supports and expanding current curriculum
- Increasing building security guards and cameras
- Enhancing building cleaning and maintenance
- Expanding Science 21 (adding the 5th grade)
- Providing resources/professional development for cohesive K-8 math program

Building the budget is always a careful process that must contend with moving numbers and educated estimates. While the District was originally anticipating a large increase in enrollment with the incoming kindergarten class for next September, we are now expecting a more moderate uptick. We are also currently estimating an increase in State Aid next year, which is welcome news. Unexpectedly, we will experience a savings related to a significant number of retirements this June, including 16 teachers, administrators, and support staff. Many of those retiring have twenty or more years of experience in the Dobbs Ferry Schools. On the other hand, the budget reflects the rising cost of health insurance, utilities, security, and custodial services, as well as contractual increases for staff.

The Board of Education and District administration have been working together over several months to build a budget that is fiscally prudent and minimizes the impact on Dobbs Ferry taxpayers, while continuing to support our important Strategic Plan. In executing that plan, we place the health and safety of our students and staff at the forefront of our decisions, while continuing to provide high-quality instructional programs that benefit student learning and academic success.

Letter from the Board of Education

Dear Dobbs Ferry School District Resident,

The Board of Education is pleased to present the proposed 2022-2023 budget, which we have carefully crafted to minimize the tax burden on our residents while honoring our community's commitment to excellence in our schools and to the safety and well-being of our students and staff. The result is one of the lowest tax levy increases that we have ever proposed.

In February, the Dobbs Ferry School District, along with the Village of Dobbs Ferry and the Town of Greenburgh, reached a settlement in the nearly four-year litigation with the Landing on the Water at Dobbs Ferry. The settlement eliminated the possibility that the District would have to pay two years of sizable property tax refunds to the Landing, thus freeing up reserve funds that we had set aside for these purposes.

The Board of Education felt that the fairest way to use those newly available funds would be to immediately ease the tax burden on our residents. As a result, more than \$960,000 from the Landing tax certiorari reserve fund has been applied to the proposed budget, thereby significantly lowering the tax levy.

This budget will maintain our instructional program while providing for a few key enhancements that we feel cannot responsibly be put off. Normally, these additions would have resulted in a tax levy increase of 2.84% in next year's budget -- right up to the statutory tax levy cap allowed by New York law. By using the newly available reserve funds, however, we were able to lower the proposed tax levy increase to only 0.48%.

We appreciate the trust that you place in us to prepare a budget that puts our children at the forefront of every decision, while doing everything in our power to protect our taxpayers. Please review the information in this newsletter and on our website and feel free to contact any member of the Board of Education or administration with questions about this year's budget. Please remember to vote on **Tuesday, May 17, 2022**.

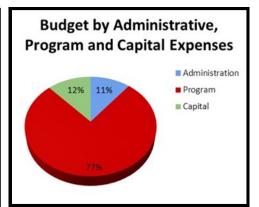

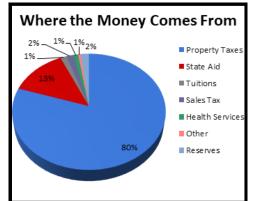

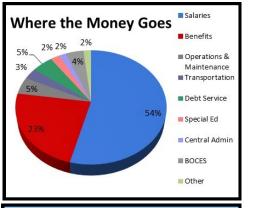

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2022-23 by the qualified voters of the Dobbs Ferry Union Free School District, Westchester County, New York, will be held at Dobbs Ferry High School in said district on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 pm, prevailing time in the Dobbs Ferry High School gymnasium, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine.

1. The basic school tax relief (STAR) exemption is authorized by section 425 of the Real Property Tax Law.

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$51,377,271 shall be appropriated to meet the estimated expenditures for school purposes for 2022-2023 and that a tax be levied in accordance with the law to meet the same.
