4. Superintendent's Report

Mr. Douglas Berry, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum & Instructions reported for Dr. Brady. She is presenting at the Learning Forward Conference in Dallas, Texas on Democracy In Education.

High School

IB for All. Promoting IB for all has been a mission of our school and district for many years now.
 The belief in providing all students with an IB education has resulted in many changes in our IB
 DP offerings, how we support all students, and of course our authorization as an IB MYP school in

- 2016. At DFHS, all students enroll in at least two IB DP courses. This year, we have registered students for over 500 subject areas for the first time in our school's history.
- Congratulations to Jolie McDonnell. She has been awarded the Acorda Scientific Excellence Award. The Acorda Scientific Excellence Award was created to encourage young people to pursue careers in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).
- Service Learning at DFHS. Our 10th graders have been reading Richard Wright's memoir, Black Boy. The memoir chronicles Richard's experience growing up in a time of extreme poverty, hunger and racism in the deep south. As our students discussed Richard's hunger regularly in class, they came up with the idea that they would like to sponsor a Thanksgiving dinner for a local family in need. As part of this project, our students came up with great ideas (such as printing out word searches and little coloring pages for the children things that don't cost anything so that everyone could get involved). They brought in items, made little signs, and even went on a field trip to Stop & Shop to shop for the items. We are very proud of their efforts. A special thanks to Ms. Fahy, Ms. Cosgrove, and Ms. Castellano for organizing this.
- DFHS Blood Drive. Our fall blood drive was a success despite the change in times due to the
 weather. We collected a total of 65 pints which means we could potentially save up to 195 lives.
 Thank you to Jolie McDonnell, Samantha Straub, and Abigail Bayer-Mertens Human for running
 the drive. We hope to see everyone again at our spring blood drive in April.
- Senior Citizen Thanksgiving Lunch. DFHS proudly welcomed our community members to the high school for an early Thanksgiving lunch that was served by our students. This is the 8th year of this great tradition at our school.

Athletics:

- At the end of each sports season, the New York State Public High School Athletic Association honors those students that excel in the classroom. The following varsity teams have been recognized by the NYSPHSAA as Scholar-Athlete teams at Dobbs Ferry High School. The scholar-athlete team is defined as 75% of the team receiving a 90% GPA or higher:
 - Girls Tennis, Girls Soccer, Girls Volleyball, Girls Cross Country, Boys Cross Country, Girls Swimming
 - Congratulations to our student-athletes for their hard work in achieving this prestigious award.
- Boys Cross Country and Girls Cross Country both finished as League Champs. Phoebe Ward and Alia Moustafa qualified for the state championship meet and were awarded All County and All State
- The Dobbs Ferry football team were Sectional Champions, Regional Champions, and East Finals Champions this season. The Eagles made it to the State Championship game at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, NY. There are over 70 teams in Class C football throughout New York State and the Eagles finished #2 in the state.
- Varsity Girls Soccer team had the most wins since 2008 and clinched a home playoff game. The
 girls won the Rivertowns Cup and Senior Kalle Person was selected as Rivertowns Player of the
 Year.
- For the second year in a row, senior Gabriella Torres, qualified for the state championship in Girls Swimming.

Curriculum & Instruction - 11/28 Innovative Classroom Initiative Update

- 28 teachers K-12 participating who have demonstrated and articulated a desire to engage in a reflective learning process, take risks and collaborate with colleagues
- The goal of the Innovative Classroom Initiative is to support the continued development
 of student centered classrooms that address the needs of the whole child through an
 exploration of the following:
 - o the role mindfulness can play in enhancing instruction
 - how classroom environments and physical space impact learning
 - o the inquiry mindset and Project Based Learning
 - Meaningful use of technology
 - Authentic learning experiences that support globally engaged learners
- Participants are engaging in a variety of activities designed to challenge and push their thinking, encourage reflection, and support their growth as educators.
- At first session participants collaborated on the development of an essential question that guides the work:
 - o "How can we foster an engaging environment where students are empowered, motivated and active learners?"
- The group has adopted the hashtag #dfinnovates and are collaborating with area colleagues engaged in similar work

- Performance Standards Based Assessment Consortium
 - o Lisa attended the meeting for Superintendents hosted by Regent Judith Johnson to learn more about the work of the Consortium and how it might apply to OF
 - o The consortium is made up of NYC schools and has successfully lobbied the NYSED to remove the Regents Exam requirements at the HS level
 - It is a two year "program" with the performance task completed in grade 11 and 12
 - No IB schools are involved
 - All schools participate in 4 required performance tasks Math, English, SS and Sci
 - Lisa "For a school like DFHS it would be difficult to do in conjunction with IB."
 - "Might be more appropriate for schools with an AP program"
 - o "The effort is in the very early stages"
 - Lisa will attend future meetings
