#### Facilities - 11/22

- Reviewed the capital projects overall
  - o District seems confident that all projects will be completed
  - o An exception is the ceiling in the library may not be replaced
- Reviewed bids for the HS/MS and Springhurst
- Committee's recommendations:
  - o Awarding Pearl River Plumbing as General Contractor
  - Auditorium abatement work will be rebid again in 2017
    - Seats can be brought through BOCES at a much lower price

### Curriculum & Instruction - 11/30

  - O Assessments are being conducted and changes being made such as:
    - Curriculum will focus on what are we teaching and why and a shift to attaining fitness instead of skill
    - Giving students more choices
- PE should engage, encourage and motivate kids to be successful
  - O Standardization of lesson structure including reflection of the days lessons
- Discussed the Athletic Option
  - o 11th & 12th graders who currently play a varsity sport can apply to the Athletic Director for an Athletic Option which means they are not required to take a PE class during the season
    - Usually for 2 seasons only
    - If schedule allows
    - Possibility of District allowing for 3 seasons
  - 10<sup>th</sup> grade JV and Varsity could be a possibility if the District concurs
    - Mr. Klaich will work with the SAC
- Tennis Courts basketball hoops have been moved off the courts
