District

 Security and Safety Table Top Exercise Workshop - Dave Connors of Connors Security Consulting conducted a workshop with District Administrators on Thursday, January 17th to review safety and security protocols and

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- procedures. Lisa and Ron will be meeting with the CEO of Altaris Security next week to discuss a shared service arrangement with another local District for Security Coordinator services and training.
- 2019-2020 School Calendar is being developed and will be shared via the Curriculum & Instruction Committee in February for BOE approval.
- Race, Equity and Diversity Training Dr. Heidi O'Gilvie will be joining us on Wednesday, May 15th for a full staff training (this is our last half-day prior to lunch).
- PYP Update Mr. Berry has created a PYP Study Committee at Springhurst. He'll be facilitating this work along with Ms. Drake.
 - The PYP Study Committee is a representative body (20) made up of members of various stakeholder groups. The PYP Study Committee is charged with the task of engaging in a thorough study of The IB Primary Years Program to evaluate the feasibility of implementation at Springhurst and the impact such implementation would have on the instructional program.
 - The PYP Study Committee will share their findings with the Board of Education prior to any decision regarding the submission of an application for candidate status as a PYP school.
 - The Committee had its first meeting last week and will be meeting for a full day with Lou Marchesano on Tuesday, January 29th. Lou worked with the district previously as we explored MYP. On January 28th from 1:30 -2:30 Lou will be available to meet with members of the BOE to provide an overview of PYP. Lou will also work in the district on Wednesday the 30th to provide support in our transition to MYP assessment and expansion of concept based teaching.

High School

- Wednesday Half Day, 1/16: Our teachers spent time working in grade level teams to plan service learning experiences for our students during the second semester. This is a major focus for the high school as we continue to find more ways to infuse an "IB for All" culture within our school. - The concepts explored
- Challenges needing to be addressed

Next Steps

Discussion included:

- We had hoped we would be further along but we are not there
- Having a shared MS & HS adds a level of difficulty
- There is no such thing as a perfect schedule there is only so much time in a day
- It needs to incorporate students' IEPs and 504's
- A school schedule frames everything such as, who we are and what our students' learning and experiences should be
- · Concessions need to be made
- It combines mechanical and philosophical elements
- · A true collaboration can take two years
- We have worked with Mike Rettig and will consult with him again
- Timeline recommendation to the Board in the fall of 2019
- · New school schedule for the 2020-2021 school year
