  - This year's Step 4 of the rankings methodology didn't include International Baccalaureate test data. - For a school to be designated "in good standing" on the NYSED Report cards, a school must have good student performance and a participation rate of 95%
- If a school doesn't meet the criteria for a three year period, they will be scored below the adequate yearly progress (AYP). This is the measure by which schools, districts, and states are held accountable for student performance under Title I of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), the current version of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.
- Our District (because of high number of opt outs) could have consequences in the 18-19 school year
- Districts are trying to push the Federal Government to change the rules

## 5. Committee Reports

## 5.01 Committee Reports

Student Activities & Athletics - 4/19

- Young Democrats Club:
  - Rebecca Baron shared with the committee her proposal for the creation of the club High School Democrats of Dobbs Ferry. The committee asked many clarifying questions and appreciated her participation. John Falino will meet with the committee in May to speak with the committee and also share proposals for 2 additional clubs (in addition to the HS Democrats).
  - Spring Sport Update:
    - JV Girls Lacrosse, JV Boys Lacrosse and Golf have been cancelled due to low student enrollment.
    - o Senior Awards related to PE and Athletics:
    - Coaches provide recommendations from the teams. There are criteria for each award. There is a committee consisting of the athletic director, principal, guidance counselor, coach, administrator and others who decide on the students who are selected for the awards.
  - Other Concerns:
    - Concerns were raised about students who are jumping in cars and racing up to Springhurst for practices and creating extremely unsafe situations for themselves and children walking from Springhurst. Andrew is working with the coaches and athletes to address this.

Facilities - 4/25

- Cleaning Bid
  - The District is required to go out to bid every 5 years. The low bidder does not have any experience with schools and did not submit a bid bond as required in our bid specifications. There is a resolution on tonight's agenda disqualifying the low bidder as nonresponsive and awarding the bid to A&A Maintenance.
- Electrical Services Upgrade
  - Work went very smoothly over the spring break on the MS/HS campus.
- MS Roof

The Middle School roof has been being patched as needed. Replacement of the roof would be close to \$1M and resurfacing would be \$400-500,000. This will continue to be an item of discussion.

Finance - 4/25

- Borrowing Update The District received four bids on its Bond Anticipation Note (BAN) to be closed on May 2, 2017. The best price received was from JP Morgan Chase with a net interest cost of 1.3300%.
- Greenburgh #11 has currently paid us through September 2016. They anticipate paying us through May 31, 2017 by June 30, 2017. As a result of recognizing previously deferred revenue and all of the 2016-2017 revenue, the District's surplus for 2016-2017 will be approximately \$500,000 more than originally projected.

  - Currently is use to allow a K-6 certified teacher to teach 8th grade ELA, and a 7-12 certified English teacher to teach 6th grade Humanities
- Change in structure of 6th grade
  - o Currently students have a "humanities block"
  - ELA (Language and Literature) double period every other day
  - o Soc. St (Individuals and Society) -double period every other day
  - Will allow for smaller class sizes in ELA (duplicate smaller class size model that has been successful in grades 7 and 8)
  - Entire building will be on identical 9 period day schedule ease scheduling of classes where teachers serve multiple grade levels
