6. Announcements

- K. Slentz announced that, as the high school fall athletics season is winding down, we have some fantastic accomplishments including:
 - 40% of our student body was involved in one sport this fall;
 - All varsity sports have winning records, and six teams are moving on to postseason play.
- K. Slentz announced that Thursday, October 30 is Soup Day at Springhurst.
- K. Slentz thanked the PTSA for Mac Field Day and the Pumpkin Fair; SPRING for its fundraising gala last Friday; and the Dobbs Ferry Schools Foundation for grant approvals and ideas.
- R. Hershberg, on behalf of Alice Dabiri of the PTSA, reported that the PTSA grossed \$13,420 at their annual Pumpkin Fair and thanked the DFSD, the community of volunteers and Mr. Slentz.

7. Board Committee Reports

7.01 Board Committee Reports

- P. Sullivan-Nunes reported the following highlights from the October 15, 2025 policy committee meeting:
 - The committee received an update from K. Slentz about possible language conflicts in Policy 0115: Student Harassment and Bullying Prevention and Intervention and state requirements;
 - The committee received an update on Policies 5130 and 5152 concerning student enrollment and residency, and admission of non-resident students;
 - The committee discussed policies that would be reviewed at its next meeting.
- P. Sullivan-Nunes reported on the NYSSBA resolutions meeting on October 16, 2025 (that lasted six hours) that she attended virtually as a delegate. She reviewed topics where the district differed from NYSSBA and where we were aligned. She shared with the board "takeaways" from the meeting to try to make future participation and contributions to the NYSSBA dialogue more productive. In summary, P. Sullivan-Nunes said that she is proud of our board and that it is consistently principled and governance-focused.
- B. Bass thanked P. Sullivan-Nunes for her participation and hard work.
- S. Reddy reported the following highlights from the October 21, 2025 student activities and athletics committee meeting:



- The committee received an update on grades 7-12 participation in sports.
- The committee received an update from K. Slentz from NYSPHSAA regarding private and parochial schools competition;
- The committee received an update on the construction project at Gould Park and the anticipated disruptions to sports. It is not anticipated that spring 2026 sports will be affected, but fall 2026 will be affected.
- B. Bass noted for the record that she was in attendance at the committee meeting.
- M. Walker reported the following highlights from the October 22, 2025 school and community relations committee meeting:
 - The committee reviewed the structure and function of the committee and will focus on the community survey as the primary purpose of the committee for the 2025-26 school year;
 - The committee received an update on the launch of the new district website in December; and
 - The committee discussed gathering an ad-hoc committee to help with the community survey.
- B. Bass added that there is room for board members on the ad hoc committee and interested members should let her know.

8. Superintendent Report

8.01 NYSED Graduate Measures Implementation Timelines and Implications for District Planning - Update

- K. Slentz introduced highlights from last November's presentation to the board on changes at the state level to graduation measures, the accountability system, foundation aid and regionalization, and informed the board that the state is keeping with its timelines and adopted the "Portrait of a Graduate" over the summer.
- D. Stinchcomb presented on the graduation measures and how that will affect grades, regents exams, and types of diplomas. The portrait of a graduate will be fully realized by 2029, which is the current 4th grade cohort.

In short, New York State is reimagining what it means for students to graduate academically, socially and civically.

These changes affect what students learn, how they demonstrate proficiency, how districts are funded, and how schools are held accountable.

Through the IB program, the district is already doing many of the things that comprise the state's portrait of a graduate.
