Dobbs Ferry Middle School Stages Musical Favorite "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat"

Dobbs Ferry, N.Y. November 18, 2013—One of the most popular family musicals comes to Broadway (505 that is) this weekend as Dobbs Ferry Middle School students bring to life *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* for all to enjoy. The show's premise is based on the Biblical parable of Joseph, found in the Book of Genesis. This "testament tale, both timely and timeless," will be performed on **Friday, November 22nd @ 7:00 pm and Saturday, November 23rd @ 5:30 pm in the Middle School/High School auditorium**. Student tickets are \$5, general admission is \$7 and senior citizens are free.

"Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat is a fun, family-friendly show with infectious tunes and a great message: Anyone can succeed, no matter the circumstances," said Dobbs Ferry music teacher and the musical's director Georgia DeFalco. "After the success of last year's Middle School production "Mixical," I thought it was time to do a full-scale musical that incorporated lots of singing, dancing, and fun! I also picked Joseph because I wanted to incorporate the Springhurst students into the show. I think the Dobbs Ferry community will love this production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat."

The storyline has little spoken dialogue (there are four narrators) and is mostly told through song. The musical numbers are set to a "mashup" of divergent, catchy styles including country-western, bubble-gum pop, rock n' roll, tango, techno and even a calypso beat! According to composer Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Really Useful Website," *Joseph* opened in an Off-Broadway production at the Entermedia Theatre on November 18, 1981 and the musical transferred to the Royal Theatre on Broadway on January 27, 1982 and ran through September 4, 1983 with 749 performances. Joseph was the first collaboration for lyricist Tim Rice and Webber. The widely acclaimed team also created musical blockbusters *Evita*, *Jesus Christ Superstar* and *Cats*.
