# <u>UPDATE: District Receives Additional State Aid</u> in the Adopted NYS Budget

- The revenue to support the District's budget includes a number of sources, the largest of which are state aid and local taxes.
- State aid to school districts includes building aid, which results from the completion or near completion of state-approved capital projects such as our Phase 1 Project.
- The budget presented to the Board of Education for adoption on April 11, 2023 included a state aid projection that was based on the Governor's February 1, 2023
   Proposed Budget as the NYS Budget, due on April 1, had not yet been approved.
- The state aid component of the Governor's February 1, 2023 *Proposed* Budget was based on data that was calculated in <u>November</u>, 2022.
- In December, DFSD had applied for early release of building aid for a portion of the Phase I Capital Project. This application was approved.
- The NYS Budget was adopted on May 2, 2023. The state aid component was based on data calculated in <u>February</u>, 2023. This included our newly approved building aid.



#### The Impact of Additional State Building Aid

- There are <u>no changes to the expenditure plan</u> that was proposed to and adopted by the Board of Education on April 11, 2023.
- The additional building aid of ~\$591,000 can now be used to offset the projected tax levy.

Based on the additional aid, the new projected tax levy increase would be 3.59%, down from the initial projection of 5.02%.

# **Projected Impact on Tax Rate**

Current Tax Rate = \$21.68 (\$21.6749)

• Estimated Tax Rate with Tax Levy Increase of 3.59% = \$20.86 (\$20.8598)
